## WAGON WHEEL CAFÉ

### The Last Call for Wagon Wheel Café

A little bit of Green Township and the westside's history is passing from the scene in 2008. The Wagon Wheel Café, a Bridgetown landmark, served up its last call on March 29, 2008. The establishment was located in the heart of Bridgetown at the Bridgetown Rd., Glenway Ave. and Race Rd. intersection. The Wagon Wheel is being demolished for road improvements at this very busy intersection that has one of the highest accident counts in Hamilton County.

The Wagon Wheel building dates back to the 1800's. An 1869 Green Township map shows a Martin Barwick Hotel on the site – whether it was the same building is unknown.

### Ruebel's Saloon

We do know that in the late 1800's the establishment was known as Ruebel's Saloon. An entry in the 1887 Hamilton County Directory shows Christian Ruebel as a saloon owner in Bridgetown. The establishment was also known as the Bridgetown Hotel with about 14 rooms. Old photos show barns just east of the saloon along Bridgetown Rd. (Cleves Pike in those days). Farmers from western Hamilton County and Indiana would drive livestock to the stockyards or slaughterhouses in the Millcreek Valley along main roads like Bridgetown Road. They would stop at taverns like Ruebel's Saloon for a meal and a few

drinks and possibly an overnight stay in the hotel. The livestock would use the nearby barns. Imagine the wild times that must have happened at the saloon over the years. The locals also relied on Ruebel's for food and, most importantly, drinks. Here is what Theresa Schaible wrote about her errands to town (Bridgetown, Cheviot) as a child in the 1890's from her family's farm along Muddy Creek Road.

*"As I recall, the only thing I was good for was to run errands, which I rather enjoyed doing; except the errand to Ruebel's Saloon in Bridgetown in hay and wheat time, with a jug for whiskey. Papa thought it inadvisable for himself and the harvest hands to drink a lot of cold well water without a dash of whiskey. I never thought anything of going barefoot on these errands, but I surely was ashamed to go into Ruebel's Saloon."*

### Andwan's Saloon

In 1907 Lawrence J. Andwan operated the saloon and hotel. An old photo shows a sign above the front door reading "L.J. Andwan – First and Last Chance – Bridgetown Hotel". Maybe the name refers to the establishment as the last chance for farmers to stop before they arrived at the stockyards with their livestock. On the return trip it was the first chance to stop and refresh themselves on their long trip home. Lawrence and later his family operated the business until 1935. After that ownership of the building changed hands several times. A later owner removed a porch along the front of the old Ruebel's and Andwan's saloon and lowered the interior floors and ceilings. A few other small businesses and apartments also used parts of the building for many years.

### Wagon Wheel

For a good part of the mid 1900's until now the establishment has been called the Wagon Wheel Café, or simply "The Wheel". That name comes from a large wooden wagon wheel hanging on the wall in the tavern. That wheel reportedly came from a

provision wagon stolen by Morgan's Raiders on their 1863 Civil War raid through Indiana, Kentucky, and Ohio. The raiders left the wheel at a farm in New Alsace, Indiana. It eventually somehow found its way to the Bridgetown Hotel. The place was then called the Wagon Wheel Café.

The Wheel's sign leading up to its last days says it all –  
**CLOSING FOREVER LAST CALL MARCH 29.**

But wait – we might still be able to experience a little of the old Wagon Wheel long after the building is gone. The owners might donate the neon Wagon Wheel sign from the tavern to the American Sign Museum here in Cincinnati.
