INDIANA INGLE TOKENS

You won't see them pictured on the side of milk cartons with a description of "round, brass, and 24 mm across". They are, nevertheless, still not found in the mainstream of token collecting. By my count there are at least 78 Ingle tokens shipped to merchants in Indiana that are unaccounted for, and that doesn't include tokens that Ingle didn't keep records of (more on that later).

Many years ago Jack Siles was able to get a copy of what is now referred to as the Ingle Costumer List (ICL). When Ingle mailed out tokens they entered merchant names and addresses (or at least city of destination) into a ledger. Once in the ledger merchants were not entered into it again. Unfortunately, they did not keep a ledger until sometime in the mid 1909 calendar year, so for some number of 1909 tokens we have no record of their issue. The ICL starts with #1 and the first 26 customers are from Georgia. Since Ingle was in Ohio, we can see that some of their early 1909 customers missed the list.

A few years later John Byars, through a friend of a friend, also obtained a copy of the ICL. John has spent a great deal of time pouring over the records, noting issue sequences and trends. By collecting as many directories as he can from all over the country he has been able to confirm what the records show in terms of merchants and their places of business in particular cities. He has also been able to pinpoint some of the early 1909 issued tokens that Ingle did not record. John and I have gone through the list of Indiana merchants on the ICL to determine what should be attributed to Indiana and what should be listed as elsewhere. As the Indiana token cataloger it has helped me a great deal to get my information on these mavericks nailed down.

John's list shows much information about each merchant and their tokens. While Ingle did not record each denomination ordered, John is keeping track of denominations discovered as they turn up. It is my intention to print this information for Indiana in an upcoming Bulletin.

What I have attempted to do in this issue is to list all of the Indiana merchants from the ICL that we have not found tokens for. Some of them may be in your mavericks box. My hope is we can get information about tokens on this list from you and be able to cross off a few of these known but missing merchants and their tokens.

By the way, if someone from another state, say Ohio or Kentucky, is interested in doing what I have done for Indiana, please contact John (see John's ad elsewhere in the Bulletin). You will need access to your state's D&B's, Polk's, etc. Not all years are needed, just enough in the 1909-19 (prime Ingle years) time frame to be able to aid in attributing tokens. I found it a very enjoyable and rewarding experience to work with John on the Indiana project.

A few comments on the list that follows. Keep in mind that the merchant ordering the token is not the name that may appear on the token. As an example, with made up names, if O.E. Ford ordered tokens, the name on the token could be O.E. Ford, Ford's Grocery, or International Grocery (if that was his place of business). Sometimes these were cross referenced in the ICL by customer #, but not always.

Some merchants placed multiple orders and we may have found one of them, but not others. For example, O.E. Ford may have a known token from 1909 with 1^{C} on the obverse, a <u>very</u> early issue (not in the list), and placed another order in 1911 (in the list). The latter token would not have the cent sign (such as it is) on it, as that was not used very long. If we don't have a known token of this latter type, then that merchant is on this list with the appropriate note waiting to be accounted for.



MARCH IKO-TAMS MEETING

There will be an area meeting of IKO-TAMS on Sunday, March 6, 2011. The meeting will be at the Civic Center in West Carrollton, OH. The meeting will start at 9:00 am. There will be buying, selling, and trading. Be sure to bring your duplicates because you will be surprised what will turn up. There is always something for everyone. After all of the trading, swapping, and buying, a short business meeting will take place.

The Civic Center (which is also the Public Library and the Police Station) is located at 300 E. Central Ave. in West Carrollton, just a few miles south of Dayton. DIRECTIONS: **South bound on I-75** take the West Carrollton exit (#47) and turn west (right) onto Central Ave. Go to 3rd traffic light (where 1-way street turns into 2-way) and turn south (left) into the Civic Center parking lot. **North bound on I-75** take the Kettering & Moraine exit (#47). You will also notice some uncertainty with initials of some merchants. The ledger is only as good as the person doing the recording was, and sometimes he had a bad day. For example, for L.E. Little from Richmond we know the tokens say L.E., but the ledger says A.E. In the above cases John uses the ledger information instead of the directories. In the case of G.G. Witte the references for 1912-16 say G.A., but the ledger has G.G. Which is correct? At this point, who knows?

These are some of the things we are trying to clear up. If you have Ingle tokens from the merchants given above please let John or myself know (contact information can be found on page 2 or page 11) so we may record the information. Please include a description similar to what is used in Wagaman's Indiana book so I may be able to use it in the 2nd Edition of the Indiana token book. Thank you for your help.

(Thanks to John Byars for his invaluable assistance providing information and editing suggestions. *KG*)

IKO FEELS THE LOSS OF THREE MEMBERS

#108 Mel Reiter

Mel was active in token collecting until the very end of his life. He attended the TAMS 50th anniversary banquet in Michigan the night before he passed away. The next day he visited a coin shop looking for new token material. Later that day he complained of a severe headache and died that evening of an apparent stroke. One comment from IKO member Paul Manderscheid, a friend of his and manager of the coin shop, "He will be missed. Mel was a person of impeccable ethics and unsurpassed drive in his collecting interest." Mel was chairman of the NTCA Ethics Committee multiple times.

Mel was the authority in the area of Dairy Tokens. His collection is documented in the <u>Catalog of Dairy or Milk</u> <u>Tokens and Related Exonumia</u>. Always interested in new material, Mel bought dairy tokens of any sort that he didn't own. He couldn't wait for a new edition to be published and issued yearly updates to those of us working on state catalogs so we could keep our records up to date.

Mel was an annual figure at the IKO October Show. Mel's table was always a must see to discover what new tokens he had for our collections.

#278 Ray Leafgreen

Ray was a collector, seller, and author of token related material, but he was so much more. A member of the military

for over 22 years, he served in Vietnam, where exposure to Agent Orange made his later life challenging and took him from us early. I will always remember him at the IKO Show in a wheelchair and on oxygen. One of his boys was always there to help, transporting him was an important part of their life.

Ray lived in Oklahoma and was a coauthor of the 2007 <u>Oklahoma Exonumia</u> book. He was an avid collector and seller of tokens. Many of us had our collections enhanced from his monthly auctions in NTCA's "Talkin' Tokens" or from his numerous offerings on eBay. Ray was always honest in his dealings and a pleasure buy from.

I talked with Ray the night before he died. He was trying to find an address of an IKO member so he could send off a Christmas card. That is typical of Ray, always thinking of others.

#16 Irwin Reuben

IKO member John Dunlap informed me that Irwin Reuben passed away in mid-January. John and Irwin were very close through the years as both had similar collecting interests in Parking and Transportation tokens.

Irwin had suffered from Alzheimer's during his later years and was living in a nursing home near one of his children in Massachusetts.
