BREAK IN OF MY CAR

I would like to tell my fellow collectors and concerned individuals of an incident that happened to me in the hopes we will all be a little more careful traveling with items of interest to ourselves.

As many of you know, I travel to coin and token shows with a file type box. I usually carry reference books, a snack, money, and even a checkbook. Visiting the Tinley Park Coin Show on June 13, 2013 in Frankfort, Illinois was not much different except that I left the check book at home that afternoon.

I left the coin show at 4:15 PM, a little later than planned since I needed to be at work at 5:00 PM. On the way to work, I stopped off at a fast food restaurant in Frankfort, IL. I visit this restaurant about once a week and have done so for the past four years or so with no incidents. At 4:32 PM or so I parked and got out of my car. I was preoccupied about getting something to eat before I started work. I heard someone running by my car. I turned around and saw a female around 20 years old. She stopped in her tracks and starting texting on her phone. I did not give it a second thought. My receipt on my bill showed I purchased the food at 4:34 PM. I sat down and ate my food and left around 4:52 PM. I noticed glass around my car and thought how I hadn't noticed the glass when pulling into the parking lot. I went to get into my car when I noticed my rear driver's side window had been smashed and two boxes removed from the back seat.

The one box contained items for work including some books.

The other box contained:

Illinois Token Book, 2nd Edition signed to me by the author Indiana Token Book, 1st Edition signed to me by the author Atwood-Coffee Catalogue of United States Transportation Tokens Book, signed by J. Coffee Parking Token Book, 5th (?) Edition, signed by the author

These books were marked with my notes on almost every page. These books can be replaced.

I also had two binders of collection notes going back to 1972. These cannot be replaced since they have been a labor of love. One book contained the first list of Illinois tokens that was published in Coin World by noted collector Tom Wall, town lists, dairy, military, coal, listings of Illinois.

The five tokens I purchased were still in my pocket. So the persons did get some money, snacks and worthless books for them and priceless to me.

The Frankfort police were called and responded in a very timely manner and took a report. I have been hoping the contents of the box would just be tossed to the side of the road and returned to me, but no luck so far.

The police told me there had been two other incidents of car windows being smashed in the town just north of Frankfort that day.

I also wonder if I was followed from the coin show that day with the thieves thinking my box of books contained more valuable coins.

Since the incident I have cleaned out my car so it looks showroom clean. I will have eyes in the back of my head in the future and park where I can see my car if I decide to stop and eat. One cannot be too careful these days.

(Over the years several of our members have been robbed by thieves looking to make a quick buck. We can't be too careful when traveling to and from Shows. Please take needed precautions when traveling to the IKO Show in October. KG)

From the East/West, Take I-70 to S.R. 48 (exit 29, Main St.), North on S.R. 48 which becomes S.R. 48/U.S. 40 (They separate in about 1 mile). At separation, go left on U.S. 40 (W. Nat'l Rd.) To the American Legion on the left.

From the North/South. Take I-75 to I-70 and go west bound on I-70. Then, follow "From East/West "directions.


