Yes, you read the title of the article right. Let's begin the story... I attended the American Numismatic Association Annual Coin Show August 13 - 17, 2013 in Rosemont, Illinois. Besides the buying, selling and trading of tokens and coins, one is able to attend educational programs in various formats: ANA seminars; 2-day intensive workshops; "Money Talks", an informative 45 minute presentation on a specific topic and collector exhibits.

There were more than 50 competitive exhibits in 20 classes. Class 8 is elongated coins. There was only one entry in this class titled, "Dottie Dow – The Queen of Elongated Coins". The display showed examples of elongated coins that were designed and rolled by Dottie Dow. To my surprise, I saw pictures of Lloyd and Alberta Wagaman in the display case. IKO-TAMS SHOW REVIEW 2013

Another IKO-TAMS Show has come and gone and our Oct. 11th & 12th event was another success. Manager Dave Gossett informed me there were 27 tables sold, with a similar number of dealers, the most since the Show was moved back to Englewood, Ohio three years ago. There were dealers and collectors from at least 12 states represented, including IN, KY, OH, MI, PA, TN, WV, IL, MA, FL, TX, and AZ. The American Legion continues to get good reviews as a show site. Convenient is a big parking lot, with dealers parking within 20-30 feet from the entrance to the Show. The lighting at the hall is exceptional. I've taken my lights three years now, and never used them yet! The free donuts and coffee both days, and the Friday Pork Chop Dinner (not free) offered by the Legion are ever popular.

Our Membership Secretary Jim Lindsay, along with Show Manager's wife Sue Gossett, manned the table at the entrance, handing out name tags, accepting dues for 2014, and signing up new members. I'm told that we had perhaps 150 or more visitors, based on the number of name tags handed out. Combine this with the approximately 50 dealers and assistants and the result was an active Show. Friday is traditionally a busier day than Saturday, but we noticed more collectors there on Saturday this year than in 2012. We missed Bulletin Editor Kevin Grant, at home recovering from major surgery. Hopefully, the card we sent with signatures convinced him he was in our thoughts. [*It was a much needed pick-me-up after not being able to attend. A big, "THANK YOU" to all involved. – KG*] Also absent were Joe Copeland and Virginia King, two members who are veteran IKO-TAMS Show dealers. Both are having health issues. Also, Gino Sanfillipo, part of the Cleveland trio (Gino, Terry Stahurski, and Ed Kucia) that handle the bidboard, had other commitments. Gino usually calls the bidboard auction.

There were several sizable deals among show dealers, including Michigan's Bob Williams and the Air Force's Mike Miller. Many dealers there I see only once a year, so it's always nice to chat with folks like Joe Bettinger from Toledo, OH; Ron Vore from Xenia, OH; Jim Hartman from PA; John Dunlap from Indiana, etc. Bob and Cindy Digiannantonio, recently relocated to Florida from Illinois, were there again. They were dealers at the Show in 2011. They sell under the ebay name generalstore99 and I am betting most token collectors actively buying on ebay have bought from them [*I know I have. They always have a good selection. – KG*] Paul and Michael Leafgreen had a table this year. They came with their late father Ray for many years, but this is the first time I recall them with a table. Paul Cunningham was there as usual, manning almost an entire wall of tables. Paul was the original IKO-TAMS Show auctioneer in the early years. Florida's Randy Partin drove up to the Show again, as he did in 2012. After he gave me a rundown of the exonumia he bought at the Show, plus side trips planned on his return home, I know he was pleased.

The Show Bidboard was interesting. Of 58 lots, 12 were passed on and 9 went to mail bidders. The remainder went to floor bidders. Highlights included a dug Tampico, Ind. High School lunch token that brought \$48 and a Panama C.Z. NCO token that catalogues for \$12 in the Cunningham catalog brought \$84. There was keen interest in a mint condition, autographed copy of Lloyd Wagaman's Indiana Trade Tokens book that brought \$130. Terry Stahurski has been a reliable and efficient bidboard manager for many years. Our hats go off to him.

The IKO-TAMS success is due to the efforts of Dave Gossett. He handles the arrangements, dealer contracts, advertising, show fliers, hall reservation and set up, with an able assistant in Ron Vore, and all the other details that most folks don't even consider, unless they've ran shows. Not only do Dave, Terry Stahurski, and Jim Lindsay, all collectors in their right, selflessly give their time to make the Show better, that is time they could be spending on the bourse floor looking for items for their own collections. I appreciate that and hope you do, too. Hope to see some new (and old) faces at the 2014 Show.

EDITOR'S NOTES

As you read earlier in the Bulletin, I have been put in the position of resigning from my post of Editor. While I would have loved to continue the job, an uncertain future health-wise (stage 4 melanoma) dictates that I step aside now rather than down the road.

It has already affected the timing of this issue, being about a month late, as I struggle to get through the chemo treatments (I will have had the last one by the time you read this) while trying to still fulfill my job responsibilities at school.

I have told President Gossett I will somehow continue to edit the Bulletin if a replacement cannot be found. However, if a replacement is not found there will come a time when issues will not be arriving in mailboxes.

If you have a commitment to seeing this arm of our organization continue, please consider contacting Dave for more details. When I volunteered back in 2005, my only qualifications were the desire to do my part for the hobby and the word processing skills to put together a newsletter of this type. I was actually expecting then President Jack Siles to turn down my offer due to lack of experience on my part.

Speaking of the Indiana book, I would like to give a big "Thank you" to Bill Hamm. He recently contributed to the project by giving me years worth of his research on Indiana tokens. It will be invaluable material when I have more time to work with it.

I am also now out of the collecting business. While I want to continue doing the research, I do not want to burden my wife with the dispersement of my collection. Look for my tables at the next IKO Show, October 10-11, 2014. You don't know how much I missed being at the Show this year. Thank you for all of your thoughts and prayers on my behalf.
