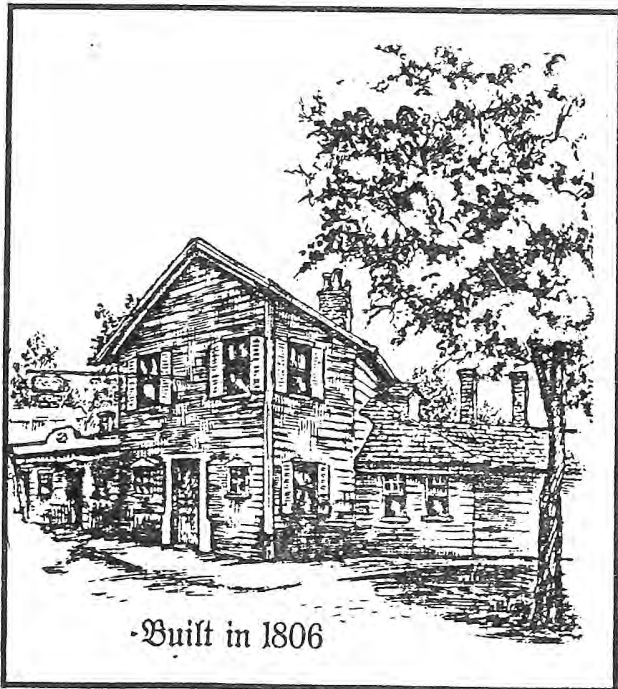
THE CENTURY INN  
A RETURN TO THE PAST

The Century Inn was one of the first carriage stops in Hamilton County, Ohio. The Inn was built in 1806 by a Mr. Van Dyke along the toll road that ran from Cincinnati north to Hamilton. It consisted of two rooms downstairs and two rooms upstairs. It has been in use 180 years as an inn, tavern, restaurant, toll house, and livery where the drivers or riders could leave their tired horses, get fresh horses and continue on their way to Cincinnati, Hamilton or Springfield. On their return, they would pick up their own horses, or drovers would stop over night as they drove their livestock to Cincinnati livestock markets. Pens were available for the livestock and they could sleep in the barn or in the inn.

It was purchased from Mr. Van Dyke by a Mr. Hartman who called it the Half-Way House, possibly implying that it was half way between Cincinnati and Hamilton.

In 1881, the present owner's great-grandfather, John Arns, bought it from Mr. Hartman and changed the name to "Old Inn". The name can still be seen on the window in the barroom.

In 1906, the business was taken over by Harry M. Arns, John's son. He changed the name to "Century Inn" since it was then 100 years old.

Harry M. Arns ran the business until 1938. After Harry's death, his son John L. Arns continued it until 1958 when he turned it over to his sister Edith Arns Brownfield who ran it until 1978. The present owner, her son Logan M. Brownfield, still maintains the traditions of his great grand father, grandfather, uncle, and mother. The barroom is a trip to the past with good food and friendly service.

John Arns issued a maverick token which was brass with eight scallops and was 26 millimeters in diameter.

Harry M. Arns issued a variety of tokens, all good for 5 cent mavericks for use at the Century Inn.

The 4 cent and 8 cent Harry Arns tokens were possibly used at the Summit Dairy which he started in the large barn that was used to house travelers horses.

*In the year 1806, when the Century Inn was first built, poets termed the Pioneer Era the era of "Romanticism" in that it "idealizes men who are close to nature: all of the early heroes were notable not only for frontier courage, but for their gallantry."*

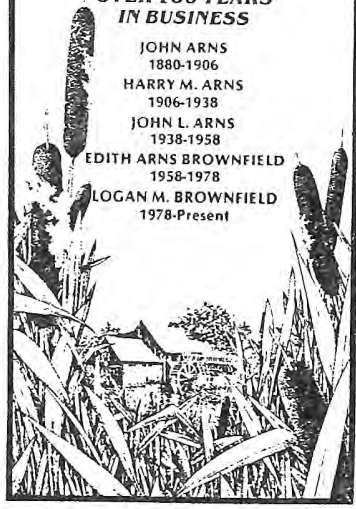
