Years later, we moved to the Airport Inn (now demolished) on the grounds of the Dayton International Airport. From there we sojourned to the Auglaize County Fairgrounds, Wapakoneta, OH. About five years ago, we moved to our present home. That's just four locations in 40 years. During this time other token/medal groups have come and gone, but our show remains and has grown to the point of being one of the best in the U.S. How did we reach this level? By the strength of our loyal membership and the willingness of some to carry the workload. I believe our founders would be proud of us. Not to be overlooked are our dealers some of whom travel long distances and incur not insignificant expenses. PASSINGS --- We also note the passing of Bill G. Raney a serious collector of Indiana tokens. He lived at Anderson, IN and was an active member many years ago. – Bob Cathcart, another well known Indiana collector was living in Kentucky at the time of his death.

We note with a great deal of sadness the passing of long-time member and good friend Virginia King on Feb. 9, 2017. She and her husband Ralph were part of our founding group. A summary of the obituary reads as follows: Age 94, died at Warsaw's Kosciusko Community Hospital – Born Dec. 25, 1922 in Warsaw. She was a 1940 graduate of Warsaw, H.S. On July 7, 1965 Virginia was married to Ralph King in Columbia City. -- He died Mar. 11, 1997. Virginia had worked as an L.P.N. for McDonald Hospital until they closed. Before retiring she worked for several nursing homes. An avid coin, tokens and medals collector, Virginia was a member of IKO-TAMS, the ANA and the American Legion Auxillary in Columbia City. In her earlier years, she raised sheep on the Larwill farm. In later years the Kings enjoyed traveling. Rest in Peace, Virginia.

This is an update to Lloyd Wagaman's original Ingle System checklist, published in 1987 by the IKO-TAMS. Inside are the most current attributions for all known Ingle System tokens; the names on the tokens, attributions, and a list of all known denominations from each merchant are shown in a compact form.

This update is based on information contained in the Ingle Customer Ledger, originally used by Ingle System to keep track of their customers names and addresses. The information in the Ledger was then verified a much as possible from secondary sources to verify the attributions; business rating directories, city directories and newspapers.
