At the end of the day, Saturday, we did not have enough IKO-TAMS members present to help put away the tables and chairs, and a non-member did considerable work to help. Next year, I will ask some of you to stick around for the clean-up. — Thanks to all who, in one way or another, made a successful show happen.

<u>VIRGINIA KING DONATION</u> --- We finished selling almost all of the widely varied donation; some in bulk lots to dealers. To date, our society has realized \$1,552. The only items yet to be sold are a fairly large quantity of foreign coins, the vast majority of which are modern minors. Over the winter I will get them organized and start disposition at coin shows and other appropriate outlets. A final report will be forth coming next year.

<u>AUCTION 2017</u> — Terry Starhuski and his able assistants did a fine job once again. The prices realized list is enclosed. Net proceeds to our treasury were \$152.50 thanks in part to the generous members who donated items.

2018 ANNUAL SHOW --- This will be our forty first. As stated before, this maybe my last. To date, no one has made it known they are interested in being show chairman. Dates will be announced in the March bulletin.



2017 IKO-TAMS AUCTION RESULTS

Despite a smaller auction than usual, this year's auction had strong bidding especially on a slabbed OH saloon token and several OH BBC tokens. Prices were also good for other OH pieces, two scarce IN tokens and a WA military token. Several pieces brought amounts considerably higher than their book values. There were only four passed lots, down significantly from last year's 15. Not counting the passed lots, the average winning bid was \$19.59. Thanks to all the consignors and bidders and to Ed Kucia and Dave Gossett for tabulating the auction results and Gino SanFilippo for calling the auction. Also, thanks to all the dealers and attendees and to all who worked behind the scenes.
