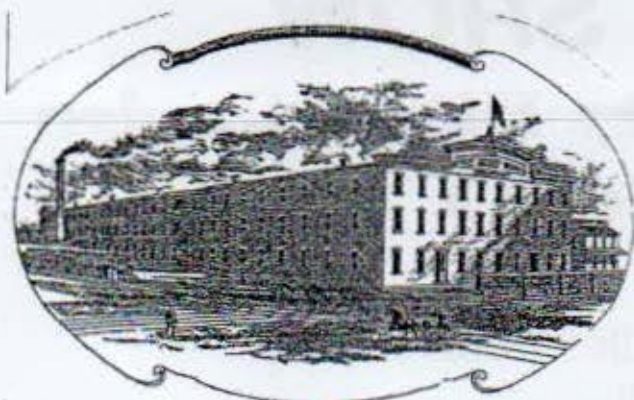
TROY, OHIO TOKEN

Source material comes from *Troy, The Nineteenth Century* by Thomas B. Wheeler, The Troy Historical Society, Troy, OH 1970.

The Troy Buggy Works (Troy, OH) was incorporated in 1891 with a capital stock of \$150,000. John McCurdy and Mark Knoop soon sold their stock to George W. Scott and John T. Knoop. At the annual meeting at the end of 1892 the company declared an eight percent dividend and reported that it paid out \$56,700 in wages during the year.

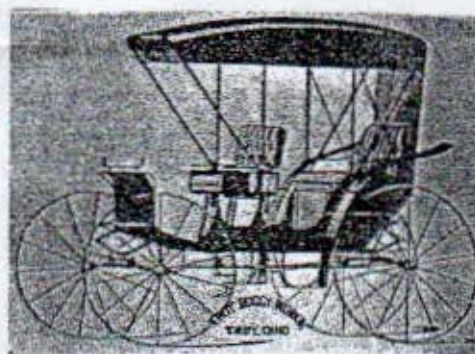
At the Transportation Building at the World’s Fair in Chicago in the summer of 1893 it had a large display of buggies and was rewarded with prizes for the best surreys. Like every other factory in the United States, The Troy Buggy Works was hurt by the business depression which began the same year.

During much of 1894 it was closed down, but in the Spring of 1895 business was so good that the company added a three-story 100 foot by 100 foot addition to its factory. It closed its repository (buggy show room) in the downstairs of the City Building and moved it to the ground floor of the new factory addition. The next year the company took an order for 11,000 butter churns to keep everyone at work.

At this time the directors were George W. Scott, President; J.T. Knoop, Vice President; J.C. Byrnett, Secretary-Treasurer; T.C. Leonard, and Henry J. Ritter.

Early in 1898 the company employed 82 hands and the payroll was \$800 per week. Later in the same year 125 people were employed. Wheeled vehicles of 35 different kinds were produced: buggies, traps, carriages, surreys, phaetons, Gladstone traps, wagons, and pony traps.

The following year the company added a new invention to a few of its buggies – the pneumatic tire. In 1900 George W. Scott left the company and W.G. Leslie of the Banner Buggy Co. of Cincinnati became General Manager. J.C. Byrnett resigned also and young Guy Scott and Janvier McKinney left to become salesmen for the Troy Cash Register Co. Clarence Snook resigned to join the Troy Carriage Sun Shade Co. where he quickly advanced to become the Factory Superintendent. Obviously, the company’s best days were past.
